Re: Response to Request for Information – Conflict Minerals

Dear Customer

This letter is in response to your request for information as to whether In2tec products contain “conflict minerals,” which the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (“SEC”) has defined as gold, columbite-tantalite (coltan), cassiterite, wolframite, or their derivatives (tin, tantalum, or tungsten).

In2tec shares the concerns of industry and other stakeholders that mining and trade of conflict minerals in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) or adjoining countries may be controlled or taxed by armed groups engaging in conflict and human rights abuses in that region. Pursuant to In2tec’s Supply Chain Policies, Suppliers are expected to assure that materials supplied to In2tec are “DRC conflict-free,” meaning materials may not contain conflict minerals that directly or indirectly finance armed groups through mining or mineral trading in the DRC or an adjoining country. Suppliers are expected to adopt policies and management systems with respect to conflict minerals and to require their suppliers to adopt similar policies and systems.

We are aware that on August 22, 2012, the SEC adopted final rules on conflict minerals reporting, pursuant to Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Act. These rules included important clarifications. The SEC excluded from the rules any conflict minerals that, prior to January 31, 2013, have been smelted or fully refined or are located outside the DRC or adjoining countries.

In addition, we have also reviewed our existing supply base, in particular suppliers of materials that contain “conflict minerals”. We can confirm that at this time there is no indication that any products we manufacture contain minerals that directly or indirectly finance or benefit armed groups in the Covered Countries.

In2tec plans to incorporate Reporting practices in our existing systems for use with our suppliers of materials that may contain conflict minerals covered by the SEC rules.
